Time	Session	Description
9:00 am-11:45 am	Input Session #18 #2 : Classroom Management & Teaching Reading	There are two input session given by one of the course tutors. Input sessions cover a range of topics dealing with learner needs, language, skills, teaching techniques, planning, and/or professional development. All CELTA centres create their input sessions to cover the syllabus set out by Cambridge.
11:45 am-12:30 pm	Teaching Practice Preparation	This time is devoted to providing candidates support for upcoming lessons. There is one trainer for a maximum of six candidates to ensure ample time for individualized support. As the course progresses, candidates learn to become more autonomous and to plan independently.
1:30 pm - 3:30 pm	Teaching Practice	During this session, candidates practice teaching with a specially arranged group of students. This is the time to develop teaching and get feedback on what you do. For half the course you will be teaching elementary students and for half the course intermediate students. Likewise, one tutor will observe half of your lessons and another tutor the other half. Each candidate teaches a total of eight lessons over the four weeks.
3:45 pm-5:00 pm	Feedback & Wrap up	Peers and tutor discuss lessons taught in the teaching practice, build upon strengths, and look at areas for improvement. At the end of each day, 30 minutes is allotted to question time, reflection and course administration.

## **Program Courses**

\* Students may start at the beginning of any course.

Course Name	Description
Learners and Teachers, and the Teaching and Learning Context	In this course, candidates examine the understanding of cultural and linguistic backgrounds of learners, and how these affect their learning of English as well as understanding different learning preferences.
Language Analysis and Awareness	Language analysis and awareness looks at key terminology used in planning and teaching the English language as well as demonstration a working knowledge of English grammar, lexis and phonology.
Language Skills: Reading, Listening, Speaking and Writing	Candidates obtain the basic concepts and terminology used for describing reading, listening, speaking and writing skills and applying these to teaching. They also understand various approaches to teaching text depending on purpose, making practical use of language teaching.
Planning and Resources for Different Teaching Contexts	This course covers the purpose and principles of planning for effective teaching, selecting, and planning lessons appropriate for various learners, and evaluating lesson preparation and reflecting on preparation for planning future lessons.
Developing Teaching Skills and Professionalism	Candidates examine classroom organization (layouts, and pair/group activities) for effective learning, making appropriate use of a range of materials and resources, and involving learners of different ability levels, and enabling them to feel a sense of progress.
